

## Electronic Lien and Title (ELT) to become mandatory Oct. 1

The Michigan Department of State (MDOS) implemented the Electronic Lien and Title (ELT) program back in March 2021. Implementing the ELT program moved MDOS in compliance with Public Acts 290-292 of 2014, which require the electronic exchange of lien and title information with lienholders in lieu of a paper certificate of title.

This notice is to inform you that the ELT program will be **mandatory** for all financial institutions as of **Oct. 1, 2023.** If financial institutions are not signed up by this date, title applications presented to the Secretary of State requiring a lienholder placement will be rejected.

As a reminder, there are two ways to sign up for the ELT program:

- Sign up with one of the four approved service providers:
  - Service providers are third-party companies that handle all ELT transactions including adding, releasing, and removing vehicle liens.
  - DDI Technologies, DealerTrack, PDP Group, and Secured Title Administration (STA) are approved service providers for the state of Michigan.
  - Additional service providers may be approved by the State of Michigan at a later date.
- Apply through MDOS online services:
  - An Authorized Requestor Application form will need to be filled out and uploaded through MDOS online services.
  - The application requires the financial institution's name, address, and Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN).
    - Entering a Corporate ID number is optional.

MDOS strongly encourages lienholders to enroll into the ELT program as soon as possible. With a high volume of financial institutions enrolling at the same time, there may be an additional delay in approving ELT applications.
